You may not need to complete the worksheet below. A correction to your FAFSA may take care of this requirement.

If you received, or will receive, a high school diploma, GED, or complete home schooling any time **prior** to the Fall 2008 semester, please go the FAFSA website at www.fafsa.ed.gov and verify your answer to question #27. This question should not be left blank. If you have a high school diploma, GED, or home school certificate of completion, and correct this question, there is no need to submit a copy to the Financial Aid Office.

If you have not graduated from high school or do not have a GED, WCC may be able to assist in paying your tuition. Please scroll down for more information.

There are federal regulations regarding student eligibility for Federal Financial Aid Programs and Ability-To-Benefit testing.

The law states that any student who does not have one of the following is not eligible to receive any type of Federal Financial Aid:

- ◆ High school diploma
- ◆ a GED or
- ◆ Compass test scores of **32** in writing, **62** in reading, and **25** pre-algebra
- ◆ ESL Compass test scores of **64** in writing, **70** in reading, and **70** in listening

Contact the Adult Transitions Office, in the Student Center at the Counseling Office, to obtain information on programs that can help you pass the GED.

Washtenaw Community College will pay tuition through a special grant fund for individuals who do not meet the above criteria. The following rules will apply:

1. Only **in-district** students will be eligible.
2. Students will receive \$50.00 for books and supplies for each course each semester.
3. Students will receive funds for a maximum of three (3) semesters.
4. After each semester, the student can retake the Compass and, if s/he passes, the student will be eligible for Federal Aid for the next semester.
5. If a student completes high school or passes the GED after the start of the semester, the student must provide verification of this in order to be eligible for Federal Aid. *Those enrolled in both high school and college are not eligible.*
6. Students must apply for Financial Aid, so that financial need can be determined.
7. Students must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress to be eligible.
