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Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both WCC and EMU agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions.
- 2. Students in this program with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning beyond the Classroom experience, and a Writing Intensive course in the major. These requirements are included in the program.
- 3. To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office.
- 4. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 5. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, 15 hours of which must be in program requirements at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 120 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 6. Application Process:
 - a. Student applies to EMU and is admitted. (Program pre-requisites must be completed)
 - b. Student applies to Nursing Program at EMU. Students must satisfy the criteria below:
 - Completed required admission courses with a 3.0 cumulative GPA [MATH general education course, CHEM 120, WRTG 121, PSY 101, (ANTH 135 or SOCL 105), (IHHS 260 or EDPS 325), (BIO 251/252 or SPMD 201/202) at EMU] or [MTH 125, CEM 140, ENG 111, PSY 100, (ANT 201 or SOC 100), (HSC 147 or PSY 206), and BIO 111 at WCC)
 - ii. Completed BIO 251/252 or SPMD 201/202 (BIO 111 at WCC) with a B- or better.
 - c. Student referred to EMU/WCC Collaborative BSN program.
 - i. Complete WCC online Admission Application
 - ii. Complete or show proof of completion of Microbiology with a C or better, Pathophysiology and the CNA certificate or equivalent.
 - iii. Supply verification of CPA, health forms, background check and WCC "Abilities Statement" (See attached) to EMU by October deadline. Copies will be sent to WCC for their records.
 - iv. Complete first semester requirements on curriculum guide.
 - v. Admitted to WCC/EMU Collaborative ADN/BSN program. Substitution made for MTH 125 instead of MTH 160.
- 7. Students must maintain continuous enrollment according to the planned sequence. Failure to successfully complete a course according to program requirements at either school will result in the student being ineligible to continue with their cohort. Student will be required to meet with a program advisor to discuss other completion options. Faculty at both schools will inform the other of student issues.

Effective Dates: September 1, 2018 until August 31, 2021.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in August 2015. Students must maintain continuous enrollment according to the planned sequence. Failure to successfully complete a course according to program requirements at either school will result in the student being ineligible to continue with their cohort. Students will be required to meet with a program advisor to discuss other completion options. Faculty at both schools will inform each other of student issues.
