Student Resource Center staff will work with you one-on-one for the entire time you are enrolled at WCC. You'll establish a relationship with a case manager who will become your trusted contact person and help you achieve your goals.

If you are a student at WCC, you are eligible to use the <u>Student Resource Center!</u> Just follow these steps:

Step 1: Make a phone appointment to begin the initial interview process by calling 734-677-5105 or 5102

Appointments are necessary for us to provide individual services, which differentiate us from other service providers on campus. Appointments can be done by phone or virtually using a computer and webcam or smartphone.

Step 2: Gather and provide your information

- The more information we have, the better we can meet your needs. Be ready with all of the following forms (or as many as you can) for your appointment:
- Have a current FAFSA on file
- Class schedule
- Booklist (if applying for a book scholarship)

Carl Perkins Grant

The Carl Perkins Grant helps pay for tuition, textbooks, and child care costs for students who have financial need and are in eligible occupational majors. Income guidelines may apply.

To qualify for a grant, you must fit into one of eight categories:

- Single parent (including single pregnant women)
- Individual with a disability
- Individual preparing for a non-traditional field
- Individual from economically disadvantaged family
- Out-of-workforce individual
- Youth who is in, or has aged out of foster care system
- English Learner
- Homeless individual (as defined by <u>McKinney-Vento Act</u>)

Foundation Grant

The Foundation Grant helps pay for tuition, textbooks, and child care costs for students who have a financial need regardless of major.

To qualify for the Foundation grant, you must:

- Meet with a Case Manager in the Student Resource Center
- Have a current FAFSA on file
- Have out of pocket cost for tuition and/or books
- Meet income guidelines
