Washtenaw Community College presents the Michigan Sheriffs' Coordinating and Training Council (MSCTC) approved 160-hour Local Corrections Officer Academy. This academy is designed for correctional personnel supervising inmates in Michigan county jails and is open to all in-service Corrections Officers as well as all pre-service personnel looking for a career as a professional corrections officer in Michigan.

The Academy curriculum consists of 15 modules and is conducted by instructors who are have extensive experience in a correctional environment and are certified by the MSCTC.

Course modules

- Booking and intake
- Correctional law
- Cultural diversity
- Custody and security
- Defensive tactics
- Ethics
- Fire safety
- First Aid/CPR/AED
- Interpersonal communication
- Prisoner behavior
- Prison Rape Elimination Act
- Professionalism and co-worker communication
- Report writing
- Stress management
- Suicide awareness
- Workplace harassment

Satisfactory completion of the academy is a requirement to become certified as a local corrections officer in Michigan. All course materials will provided for each student. Class attendance is mandatory for all academy modules. If any portion of a class is missed, it is the responsibility of the student to arrange for completion of the missed class.
