1. General Description of Program (purpose, curriculum design, need for new courses):

This program is designed to train students to create professional digital video productions. These will include informational, documentary, instructional, commercial, artistic, as well as how to integrate with multimedia productions. It includes all facets of video production from program design (preproduction), hands-on recording (production) through the editing process (post-production).

2. Need for Program (new jobs, industry changes, etc...):

The proliferation of cable, satellite, and Internet access has created a demand for these skills. Particularly students who have not only the theoretical background in the visual arts, but also the necessary skills to produce a finished project. The more diverse a student's background is regarding this emerging technology, the more marketable they will be.

3. Enrollment Projections:

Due to time constraints, enrollment for Fall 2001 will begin modestly at approximately 48 students; divided into lecture/lab class size not to exceed 24 students. Equipment resources will ultimately determine these numbers. Eventually, it is expected that enrollment will increase significantly within one or two years. It is estimated that two Video I courses and two Editing I courses could be offered for Fall 2001.

4. Instructional Resources and Space Needs (equipment, labs, classrooms, consumable supplies):

A lecture space with a capacity for 24 students as well as the ability to show mini DV tapes, VHS tapes, DVD discs, as well as a computer connected to an appropriately configured digital video projector. In addition, space and personnel must be allocated for the storage, maintenance, reservation, and control of all cameras, accessories, and editing facilities. Cameras and editing stations should be reserved for currently enrolled students only. Individuals who will be responsible for allocating these resources must be properly trained in order to maximize the equipments' usefulness. Students will be expected to supply their own mini DV tapes – two tapes minimum at approximately \$10.00 each.

5. Faculty Resources (full-time, part-time, consultant):

Initially one full-time faculty member will be required to teach the first courses. This faculty member will also be required to ensure that the purchase of all the equipment and software happens

in a timely manner. This will be followed by part-time faculty as needed. In addition, the full-time faculty member will require a computer, firewire hard drive, DV deck, and accessories capable of utilizing necessary software. A secure, private office is required. Eventually, an office with an appropriate computer and software would be required for part-time faculty to share.

6. Curricular Connections (Other WCC instructional units, articulations, accreditations):

7. Program Development Plan (timetable, costs, personnel):

Because of time constraints (Fall 2001), the initial course offerings will be modest. As demand and collaboration increase, however, the course offerings as well as numbers of students will also increase. Courses offered during Fall 2001 could again be offered in Winter 2002 (dependent upon demand), plus additional, more advanced courses in Digital Video Production and Non-linear Digital Editing. Other courses in collaboration with other departments and programs tailored for media gathering could also be offered during the Winter 2002 semester.
