8.	Critically analyze audiences in relationship to queer literature (such as original historical audiences, contemporary audiences, developmental audiences, etc.).
9.	Identify connections between queer literature and current events.
10.	Reflect on personal growth as it relates to understanding and engaging with queer literature.
