Students will develop listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in standard Japanese, corresponding to the high novice level on the American Council on Teaching Foreign Languages (ACTFL) proficiency scale. Students with prior knowledge of Japanese are welcome in this class.

- 8. Recognize Japanese speakers' traditions, way of life and Weltanschauung.
- 9. Describe the cultural context of the Japanese language, Japanese ways of life, and sociocultural conventions.
