- 4. Recognize and differentiate the Japanese writing systems (Hiragana, Katakana, and Kanji characters) as interpreted from oral speech.
- 5. Read and comprehend beginning-level texts containing Hiragana, Katakana, and Kanji characters.
- 6. Use novice-level grammatical models to construct sentences using Hiragana, Katakana, and Kanji characters.

- 7. Communicate basic information in spoken Japanese.
- 8. Recognize Japanese speakers' traditions, way of life, and Weltanschauung.
- 9. Recognize and describe the cultural context of the Japanese language, Japanese ways of life, and sociocultural conventions.
