Course Objectives

- 1. Recognize person-perception principles, which help explain why humans often fail to realize that the negative behaviors of another person can be influenced by their situation rather than by their inherent nature.
- 2. Apply group influence principles to identify the ways that social environments can sway one's thoughts, feelings and behaviors away from one's individual tendencies.
- 3. Identify the environmental influences on one's memberships, purchases, and identities based on the principles of persuasion and attitude change.
- 4. Identify the social forces that contribute to sexism, racism, and other prejudicial and discriminatory concepts.
- 5. Apply the principles of interpersonal relationships to identify how social environments affect the likelihood of someone exhibiting aggression, empathy, altruism and attraction.
- 6. Describe social psychological principles contributing to a significant past decision (e.g. choice of college, career, relationship).
- 7. Describe social psychological principles that contributed to a meaningful argument with a family member or friend.
- 8. Develop a strategy based on social psychological principles that can be helpful in one's future employment.
- 9. Identify the social psychological factors that contributed to a time in your life when altruistic behavior was an option, and describe your reasoning for adopting or not adopting the altruistic behavior.
- 10. Describe social psychological principles underlying a case of historical racism in the United States.
- 11. Describe social psychological principles underlying a current case of racism outside the United States.
- 12. Describe social psychological principles underlying a case of aggression in the news.
