Student Records has discretion to give <i>elective credit</i> for AP work that has not been specified as a WCC course equivalent. 2. Exclusively, the Office of the Executive Vice President for Instruction determines course equivalencies. 3. Students who earn a grade of three (3) or higher on an AP test shall be considered to have met college-level reading and college-level writing requirements without additional testing.
