Tips for a Great Zoom Session

MUTE YOURSELF

If you aren't speaking, please mute yourself! Even quiet background noises can be distracting to the rest of the session participants. If you un-mute yourself to speak, avoid typing and promptly mute yourself again when finished.



USE THE CHAT BOX

The chat box is a feature made to communicate with others during a presentation. It's a great way to ask questions or make comments without talking over anyone. If you do not know where to find the chat box, be sure to ask the host at the beginning of the session.



ARRIVE ON TIME, STAY THE WHOLE SESSION

It is always best practice to arrive on time to a session. However, if you join late, enter quietly and unobtrusively. Please stay the whole session for full PD credit!



AUDIO OR VIDEO FREEZING?

You might have a poor internet connection. Try turning your video off for a while, or utilize an ethernet connection. This is especially true for sessions with a large number of attendees.



STOP VIDEO IF:

- There are visual distractions in your background;
- You're moving your device;
- You need to absent yourself for a moment.



BE PATIENT!

This is different for all of us; be extra patient with technology, yourself, and others. Hosting? Assume at least one person in your session is brand new to this - a little kindness will go a long way!

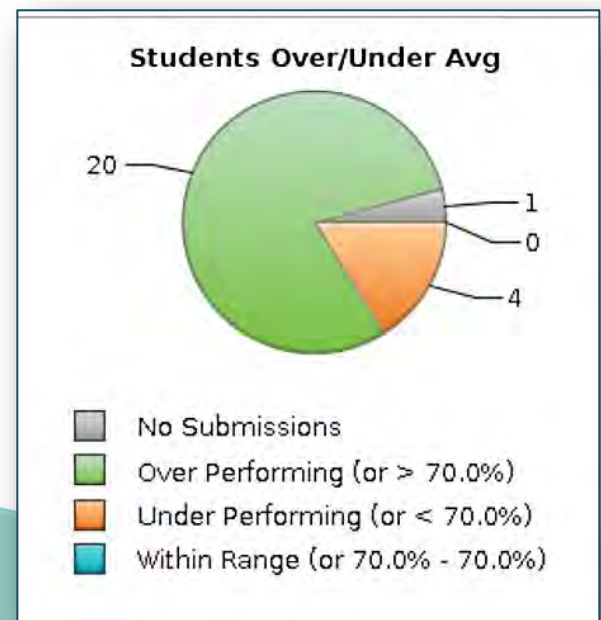

(RE-) INTRODUCING THE BLACKBOARD GOALS TOOL

Looking to ease the burden of assessment? Consider using the Goals Tool in Blackboard. If students are taking tests in Blackboard, we can help you align test questions with Student Learning Outcomes. After the initial set-up, you will be able to run reports showing the assessment data needed to answer the assessment questions for that outcome. Rubrics can also be aligned with outcomes to collect data for reporting.



WONDERING IF IT WILL WORK? HERE ARE COMMENTS FROM SOME OF THE FACULTY WHO HAVE TRIED IT.

The Goals Tool helped demystify the assessment process by providing the perfect framework for verifying my course material. The resulting reports (magically exported straight from blackboard) give a crystal-clear picture of what's working and what needs improvement. I highly recommend this approach for anyone who's found themselves guessing at how to verify their material or struggling to understand the assessment process in general.

Like any new tool, there is a learning curve. However, once the alignment is complete, the result is a beautiful report with bar graphs and pie charts for each outcome, along with links to drill down the data. We no longer need to cull through data and stare at just the numbers to tell our story.

Using the performance tool on blackboard to assess courses has created the ability to both streamline the submission process and access the artifacts. In addition, using secondary rubrics offers the opportunity to align the rubric to student learning outcomes and performance indicators and obtain summary data within the program. Ultimately, it offers the ability to access the data at any time and generate reports well into the future to compare past and present performance.

Using the goals tool with my rubrics in blackboard have allowed me to assess multiple assignments (sometimes as many as 13!) Mental health, financial strain, work schedules, family commitments - these are just some of the circumstances that can become a barrier to our students' success. 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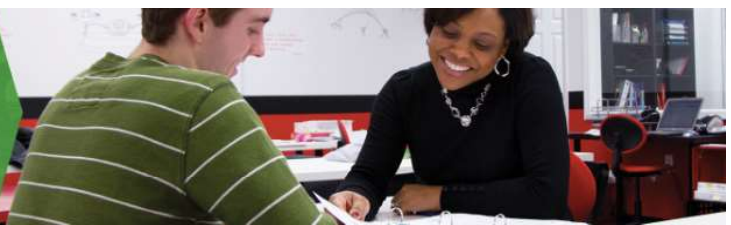

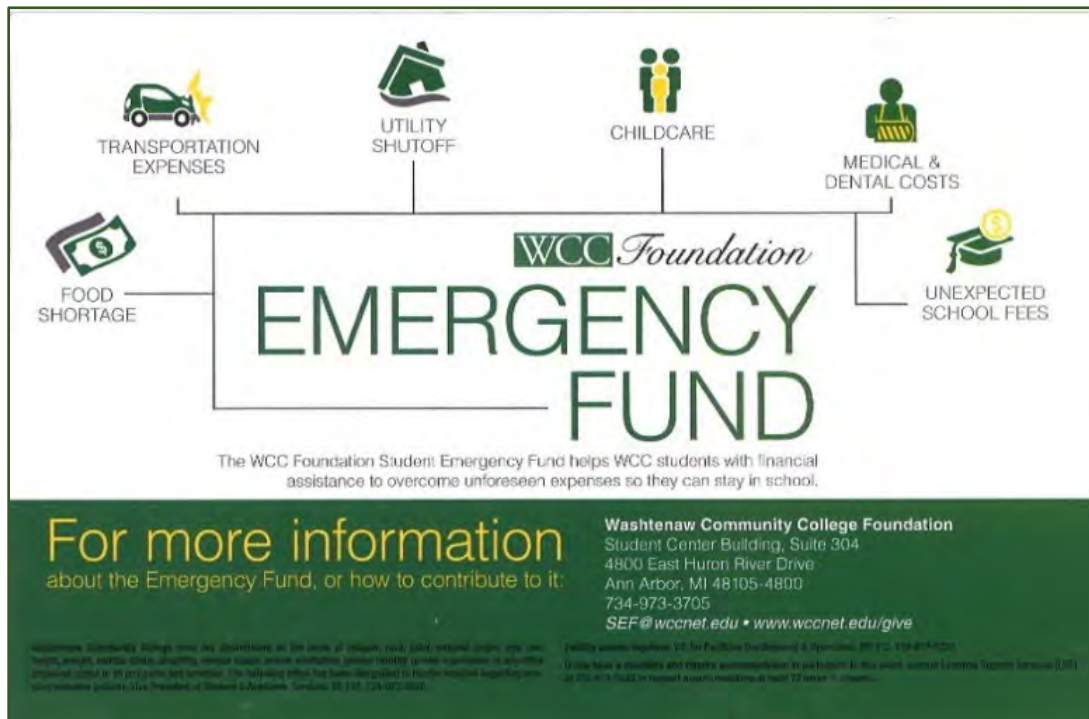

Student Success COACHING

As success coaches, we strive to build **positive, growth-focused relationships** with our students as they embark on their academic journey. We help **guide** students in developing the **skills** and **networks** they need to define, achieve, and maintain their **goals**.



Proactive Outreach

Students don't always ask for help, or even know what help to ask for! Success Coaches proactively reach out to students through email, text, and phone. Students are often referred to Success Coaching from faculty and staff, and we also use student data (like faculty early alerts, mid-term grades, course drops/withdraws) to identify students who might need extra support.

1-1 Coaching

In our 1-1 coaching sessions, Success Coaches work with students to define goals, identify strengths, and prepare for obstacles and challenges to success. Common concerns are time management, getting organized, and following through on priorities. We also support students who have significant barriers - like finances, food insecurity, work/life/family balance - and connect them to resources.

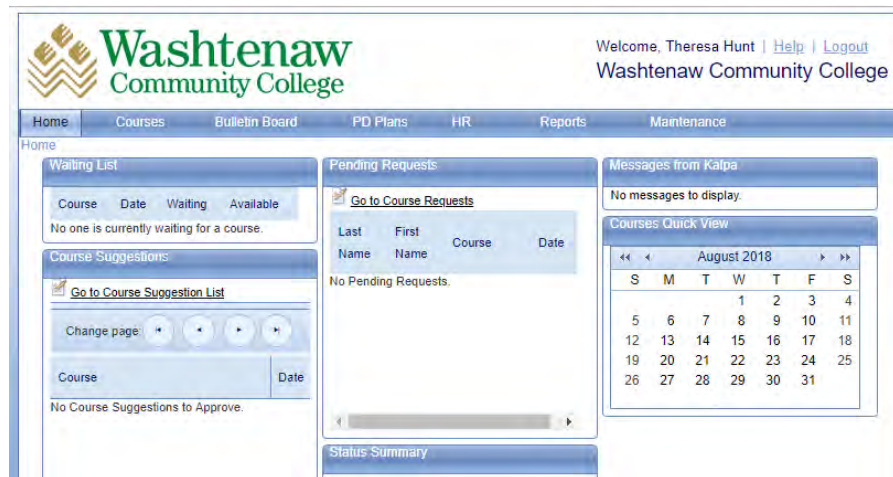

Full-Time Faculty Professional Development Requirements

- Any TLC session/course you lead – leading a 1 hour session = 1 hour PD credit:
 - Submit your session ideas & the TLC will coordinate the rest:

- PD credit will be calculated by scheduled hours per session:
 - 1 hour scheduled session = 1 hour of PD credit

What Doesn't Count

- HR Essential Training (*completed on Blackboard each year; 100% completion of this course required of all WCC Employees*).
- Off-campus professional development (conferences, speakers, etc.).
- Department, Division, Faculty, or other meetings that are already part of your professional responsibility as a faculty member.

How it Works

- Register anytime for sessions or courses listed on KALPA!
- Attend a session. Your attendance will be verified, and your completed PD hours will be updated in KALPA, so you always know how many hours you've completed and how many hours you have left to complete.
- Currently there are over 100 hours of courses available for you to take to earn your 16 hours, and sessions will be continually being added throughout the school year.

Faculty Professional Development *by Faculty, for Faculty*

Part-Time and Adjunct Teaching Faculty Professional Development Opportunities

Part-Time and Adjunct Faculty (teaching credit classes) are eligible to receive \$25 stipends for attending professional development sessions offered by the Teaching and Learning Center listed on KALPA.

What Counts

- Any TLC session listed in KALPA with any of the following tags:

To receive credit, you must send a "Session Completion" Email (include session title & date of completion) to TLC.staff@wccnet.edu.

What Doesn't Count

- HR Essential Training (*completed on Blackboard each year; 100% completion of this course required of all WCC Employees*)

Guidelines for Stipends

- Faculty are required to registered in advance for the session
- Faculty must attend the FULL session
- Faculty must be actively teaching credit class(es) to earn stipends
- Stipend payment will be limited to four (4) sessions per month
- Stipend payment will be paid monthly

Disclaimers

- Stipend payments will not be issued to those that have a full-time position at WCC.
