I had earned my Bachelor's in Business Administration at Eastern Michigan University by the time I was 20.

When I was 18 years old, I was selling 20 houses a year. I'm 26 now and the number five top producer among Washtenaw County realtors. I'm the president-elect of the Ann Arbor Area Board of Realtors Board of Directors, the youngest member elected to the position.

I'm my own boss now with the independence I've always valued. The trust and respect I received at WTMC gave me the opportunity to achieve more at a younger age.
