My husband and I then moved to Chicago where I worked as a substitute teacher. I later taught computer science to high school, and then middle school students. We had two children, and after moving to Fremont, California, we had our third.

I plan to return to teaching. In the meantime, I'm with my children and volunteering. I'm currently working with others to open a middle college here, just like WTMC.
